



# TRANSFER PATHWAY GUIDE 2025-2026

Associate in Science to Bachelor of Science in Human Nutrition

### Overview

Completion of the following curriculum will satisfy the requirements for an Associate in Science at the Kentucky Community and Technical College System and leads to a BS in Human Nutrition at the University of Kentucky.

### **Admission Requirements**

Students must meet the University admission requirements to be admitted into any major within the College of Agriculture Food and Environment (M-G CAFE).

KCTCS students planning to transfer to the University of Kentucky should work closely with a UK Transfer Advisor each semester to ensure that both KCTCS and UK degree requirements are met.

### Degree Requirements

The College of Agriculture, Food, and Environment requires that students start the Human Nutrition program as a pre-major. In order to be admitted into upper-division status and take upper-level (300-level and above) DHN classes, students must meet the admissions policy of obtaining a 2.8 GPA in the following courses: CHE 170, 175, 180, 185; BIO 148, BIO 152, or BIO 208; DHN 212 and 241. The chemistry and biology courses can be taken through KCTCS. DHN 212 and 241 are taken through UK; they are offered fall, spring, and summer semesters. The admission policy should be met before transferring to UK to keep on track with upper-level courses in Year 3 of the program.

### **General Transfer Requirements**

All prospective transfer students are encouraged to receive advising from the University of Kentucky Transfer Center. Appointments are offered online and in-person, and can be scheduled online at https://www.uky.edu/admission/transfer-advising.
